

2020 Adopted Budget

The Board of Commissioners adopted the 2020 operating budget at its December 9, 2019 meeting. The 2020 budget for the general and sewer funds totaled \$48,011,000 and \$4,728,181, respectively. A modest 1.5% real estate tax increase was adopted, along with no change to the sewer rate and an \$18.00 per year increase to the trash and recycling fee, which now stands at \$245.00 per year. For property owners with an estimated median assessment of \$145,000, the budget increase equated to an annual increase in Township real state tax of \$19 per year. For property owners with an estimated average assessment of \$175,000, the annual increase amounted to approximately \$22 per year.

The saturated recycling market continues to be a challenge for every municipality. Still, Haverford is committed to recycling! While we had hoped the recycling market would stabilize to our benefit, we have to reconcile ourselves with its continued state and the nearly 100% increase in per ton recycling charges levied against us.



All local indicators, as well as, the nation-wide narrative lead to the same conclusion that the recycling environment will remain "as is" for the foreseeable future.

2020 will be an ambitious and exciting year for capital projects in Haverford! The capital projects fund budget of \$19,263,255 includes funding for new hybrid and electric vehicles, continued work on the Pennsy Trail, over \$1.8m in park improvement projects, over \$500,000 in planned improvements at the Skatium, additional road resurfacing, over \$100,000 in improvements planned for our historic structures and capital improvements for the Library and Brookline sites. The staff is excited to see these plans through to completion and hope residents enjoy the improvements made throughout our Township.




Billboards in Haverford Update

In 2009, a petition was filed with the Haverford Township Zoning Hearing Board by Bartkowski Investment Group (BIG), challenging the validity of the Township's sign regulations with respect to billboards. The petitioner asked the Zoning Hearing Board to find wheather the ordinance improperly excluded the use and proposed to develop non-accessory advertising signs at four sites: 600 and 658 Lancaster Ave., and 1157 and 2040 West Chester Pike. The drawings filed with the petition proposed a billboard and support structure 48 feet long and 17 feet tall, with an overall height of 52 feet and an advertising surface (48' x 14') with 672 square feet. In 2012 Haverford Township Zoning Hearing Board rejected the billboards proposed.

BIG appealed the 2012 decision of the Zoning Hearing Board to Delaware County Common Pleas Court, where the Township's decision was upheld. The company then further appealed to the Commonwealth Court, which reversed the county court, and remanded the case back to Delaware County.

This December, BIG proposed signs smaller in scale, approximately 500-square-feet and 47 feet high. In January, the case returned to Delaware County Common Pleas Court for consideration before Judge Spiro E. Angelos. In anticipation, our elected officials organized two community information sessions to advise residents on the proposals and upcoming court proceedings. Judge Angelos continued the case until February 20, 2020 so at the time of this writing, no ruling has been made. We will keep the public informed via our website and social media once the Court has made a determination.

Fences, walls and retaining walls may **NOT**:

- •be constructed or replaced without a permit
- •exceed six feet in height
- •be placed in a front yard or extend into the right-of-way
- •be constructed with the "finished side" facing in
- •create a hazard to traffic or pedestrians
- •have barbed wire, spikes or other dangerous features
- •interfere with access by the Fire Department

Building permit applications must include the following:

- •A diagram of the property indicating the location of the fence. If the property is a corner lot, measurements from the center of each road must be provided on the diagram.
- •A description of the proposed fence including:
- ~ fence height from the ground to the highest portion of fence
- ~ type of fence (ex. chain link, split rail, stockade, etc.)
- ~ fence visibility (ex. spaced picket with 2" boards and 1" space) or indication that the fence is solid. If the fence includes a solid and open portion, please indicate the height of each (ex. 4' solid with 2' alternating board.)
- ~ linear feet of total proposed fence

Please contact the Zoning Office for further instructions and additional regulations for fencing corner lots.

your vehicle in a responsible manner. Parking within 30 feet of a stop sign and within 20 feet of an intersection are violations of state laws. We also see an increase in vehicle's blocking driveways and parking on lawns. These violations decrease driver's field of view and increase the chances of motor vehicle accidents. Please be a courteous driver.

Please be aware of suspicious calls, emails and texts you may recieve. In recent weeks, we have reports of residents being victimized by scam artists using these methods to commit their crimes. Always be leery if the form of payment is electronic/gift cards/ Wire Transfer. Officers from the Department were given Life Saving Commendations for actions they took that helped save 2 lives.

On Thursday, September 12, 2019 police and medics were dispatched to the YMCA. Officer Kenny arrived on scene and was led to the victim in cardiac arrest on the gymnasium floor, after playing basketball with his 13-yearold son. Officers immediately began chest compressions and recognized the need to utilize an AED. After shocking, officers continued CPR, switching off when necessary, until the arrival of Narberth Ambulance personnel. Sergeant Reynolds, Officer Fuller and Officer Kenny took direct, immediate and positive action to preserve the life of another human being who was clearly in danger of dying.

Then, only 4 days later, on Monday, September 16, 2019, police were dispatched to Citizens Bank, 160 West Eagle Road, for a report of a subject down. Officers Fuller, McCreight and Viola arrived on scene and found the victim was in cardiac arrest. Officers immediately began chest compressions and recognized the need to utilize the AED. Sergeant Reynolds, Officer Fuller, Officer Kenny, Officer McCreight and Officer Viola instinctively acted in a heroic manner and provided

lifesaving treatment at the most critical stage. These Officers are a credit to themselves, Haverford Township and the Haverford Township Police Department. For their actions, they were awarded an official Commendation for a Life Saving Event.

Great job by all the Officers involved!

The Board of Commissioners established an anti-discrimination policy (Ordinance 2626, Chapter 183) in February of 2011. The Ordinance prohibits discrimination in employment, housing, and public accommodations (such as restaurants, stores, and banks) on the basis of race, color, religious creed, ancestry, age, sex, national origin, disability, use of guide or support animals because of blindness, deafness or physical disability of the user or because the user is a handler or trainer of support or guide animals. It also covers a person's actual or perceived sexual orientation, gender identity or gender expression.

The Human Relations Commission (HRC) – comprised of seven community members charged with hearing complaints alleging violations of the Ordinance – ensures that all members of Haverford Township enjoy equality and equal protection under the Ordinance. It achieves this through education, community outreach, and mediation of complaints. The HRC is non-partisan and non-profit, and there is no charge for its services.

Over the summer we had an increase in reported thefts from motor vehicles. Typically, these thefts are crimes of opportunity occurring during the overnight hours. Take away the opportunity by locking your vehicles and placing any valuables out of view.

Please be aware of suspicious calls, emails and texts you may receive. We have reports of residents being victimized via communication devices. One such scam involves receiving a text or email from someone you know. The person asks for money in the form of gift cards and it appears legitimate. However, criminals are hacking your device or "spoofing" a phone number to steal money by deception. We encourage you to speak to the person before any money is exchanged. Always be leery if the form of payment is electronic/gift cards/wire transfer. Visit https://www.havtwp.org/ Police_Department or contact the police if you suspect you are a victim of a phone scam.

On June 26, 2020 we celebrated the retirement of Officer Mark Semerad and his K9 partner Kato. Officer Semerad served the township for 26 years and had the honor of being the department's first K9 officer. Officers Semerad and Kato were partners for 8 years. Thank you both for your service to the residents of Haverford Township.



We would also like to congratulate Officer Thomas Murtha on his appointment to the position of Police Officer. Officer Murtha graduated from Kutztown Univ. with a degree in Criminal Justice and has three years experience as a police officer. Officer Murtha was sworn in on June 26, 2020.

The Officers of the Haverford Township Police Department have been working diligently throughout the COVID-19 pandemic to provide the consistent level of service township residents expect. During this time we have protected ourselves and the community by practicing CDC recommendations of social distancing, personal protective equipment and sanitization of equipment. We would like to thank the residents of Haverford Township for their patience and continued support.

Finance

COVID-19 FINANCIAL UPDATE

When the COVID-19 pandemic hit, we all were faced with unprecedented concerns. The Township is a business too – a special, service-oriented business – but a business nonetheless. We too had to take a hard look at our finances and prepare as best we could as we entered an unknown. We curtailed spending where we could, reevaluated staffing, and while we had to temporarily close two of our larger revenue generating operations - the recreation program and the Skatium, all of the Township's essential services kept going strong. The news has reported that many cities and towns across the country currently find themselves with unprecedented financial challenges due to the pandemic. It's important to note that many of those cities and towns are largely dependent on a sales/wage tax or are in tourist areas of the country that heavily rely on travel/entertainment industries.

Luckily for Haverford, our economic makeup does not rely on those severely impacted revenue streams. However, we, like every other business have areas that we are closely watching. Along with lost revenue from our closed programs, we lost revenue from plummeting interest rates, suspended parking meter enforcement and general lack of most revenue generating activities for a few months. Our real estate tax collection rates are strong but we are still awaiting receipts from our business tax returns (extended until July 15 in conjunction with the IRS filing extension). We also saw strong performance in our code enforcement department and our local real estate market proved its resiliency with reduced but stronger than expected realty transfer tax returns. Business taxes account for \$2.75M of our general fund budget. Since our business tax is based on prior year gross receipts, we will see some financial impacts of the pandemic in 2020, but possibly even more so, in 2021. Our business community will continue to rebuild along with the rest of the country. While the world continues to navigate through the COVID-19 pandemic, we too are weathering the storm. Our healthy reserves, strong cash position, and timing of our tax calendar all played in our favor and we continue to be on stable financial ground.

TOWNSHIP REAL ESTATE TAX UPDATE

As of September 1, the Township enters the penalty phase which was extended from June 1. Please remember that Citizens Bank is unable to accept real estate tax payments on our behalf. Please mail all township real estate tax payments to the Township building at 1014 Darby Road, Havertown, PA 19083.

TOWNSHIP BORROWING UPDATE

Back in March as we prepared to

refund our 2014 General Obligations bonds, the Township had its credit rating evaluated by Moody's Investor Services. We are so proud to announce that the Township received a Aaa rating for the first time in the history of Haverford Township. Moody's cited our "robust and improved financial position, sizeable and growing tax base, and manageable debt burden". While it was delayed due to the daily changes in economic conditions, we were able to successfully refund our 2014 General Obligation Issue in June. This refunding will save \$1.995M dollars over the course of the debt

COUNTY REASSESSMENT UPDATE

Property owners should have received their final assessment values from the County in July. These values will go into effect on your 2021 property tax bills from the county, township and school district. Historical Commission

As reported previously, the Haverford Township Historical Commission received a \$16,000 grant through the Certified Local Government program of the PA State Historic Preservation Office. The grant will be used to assist the Commission in meeting its obligation under Township Ordinance No. 2580-2009, to "Maintain and update the Historic Resource Survey and Inventory of Historic Resources." In June, after a competitive proposal process, the Township retained the professional consulting firm of Richard Grubb & Associates to update photographs of existing buildings

sites on the Historic Resources Survey (not updated since 1994!), and to identify historic resources that could be added to the Survey to promote preservation of Haverford Township's historic character. Work on this project began this summer and expected to be completed by the end of the year.

Sewer Alert

Sewer backups and flooding can cause devastating property damage and are not covered by standard homeowners' insurance policies. The majority of these claims are the responsibility of the property owner. Sewage from sanitary sewer lines occasionally back up into houses through drain pipes. These backups not only cause extensive water damage that is difficult and expensive to repair, but also create health hazards.

Haverford Township is not responsible for damages caused by sewers, drains and sump pumps except under limited/special circumstances provided by the PA Municipal Immunity laws.

Township residents must be aware that they should review their homeowner's, flood and sewer backup insurance coverage with their agent/insurance companies in order to properly protect their personal residence—probably the most valuable tangible asset that we all have.

Our Township Code states that all sewer service laterals from the Township's sewer, regardless of location, are the property of the customer and/or owner and shall be maintained by him in good condition and repair.





Dear Neighbor,





POLICE

In July, the Pennsylvania Law Enforcement Accreditation Commission announced that our Police Department had become an "accredited" agency in Pennsylvania. Our Department is constantly striving to deliver professional police services to our residents and visitors. Essentially, an outside commission examined our policies, procedures, and headquarters to ensure we are providing services in the best way possible. Haverford is only one of 126 agencies in the Commonwealth to achieve the level of Accreditation since the program started in 2001. As we fight the opioid epidemic, the Police Department continues to carry the life-saving drug, Naloxone. So far in 2020, officers delivered the drug fifteen times and helped save thirteen lives. SOLSMART BRONZE DESIGNATION

In September, Haverford Township received a SolSmart Bronze designation (with a Special Award for Inspections) for promoting solar development by making the process faster, easier and more affordable.

Led by the International City/County Management Association and The Solar Foundation, SolSmart is a national program recognizing cities, counties, and regional organizations that foster the development of solar markets.

According to ICMA and The Solar Foundation, unnecessary paperwork and other burdensome requirements at the local level increase costs and discourage solar companies from moving to the area. By streamlining these requirements and taking other steps to encourage solar development, these local communities become "open for solar business."

The SolSmart designation recognizes Haverford Township for helping remove obstacles and encourage solar energy development. The program involves consultation with a mentor-expert in the solar field and evaluation in eight categories including:

permitting; planning, zoning & development regulations; inspection; construction codes; solar rights; utility engagement; community engagement and market development and finance.

Haverford joins less than 400 communities in America to earn this designation and shows that Haverford Township is "OPEN FOR SOLAR"!

COMPREHENSIVE PLAN UPDATE AND Q&A

The next step of our planning process is to seek public input on the future development and conservation of the Township. In March 2020, an interactive public workshop was scheduled to allow residents to walk around to various stations, directly communicating with members of the Comprehensive Plan Committee to voice their input on each topic. However, due to COVID-19, this "hands-on" workshop was cancelled. We wanted to share the two most asked questions we've received over the past few months:

Why can't this workshop be held via telecommunications or other online format?

While online options similar to the interactive format of the in-person workshop are available, we feel that these alternatives could exclude members of our community who may not have the technological knowledge or means to participate in this way.

When will the Comprehensive Plan move forward?

While the Comprehensive Plan Steering Committee is very anxious to move forward with this project, our highest priority is to keep our community safe. Alternative options for this workshop have been discussed and will be announced once they are ready for implementation.

We know it's difficult but let's continue to be patient as we weather through the pandemic. A comprehensive plan is so important and will guide development for future generations. We also want to give this plan its due justice and include as many stakeholders as possible.

BEES AT THE GRANGE ESTATE

Beekeeping at the Estate started with the early residents, going back to Penn's 1682 land grant. The bees, which can fly anywhere from 2 to 7 miles from the hives, were raised to help pollinate up to 700 acres of farm land on the Estate.

The remains of the original hives were found in the carriage house and restored in the spring of 1976, with the first honey product extracted in July 1977. The four restored hives are located behind the lower spring house on the northern part of the property, which is now home to a breed of Italian Honeybees. These bees are gentle and produce delicious honey with an even greater yield.

The Estate is extremely grateful for the number of volunteers who have joined the beekeeping group. Our current instructor and main beekeeper is Hazel Delikatny, who took over for Beverly Rorer.

Each July, the public is invited to visit and help in the process of extracting honey from the hives. This is a fun event for adults and children of all ages, as everyone can help with the different steps of the process. This past year, the bees (and their beekeepers) produced over 100 pounds of honey. The honey was sold on weekends from the Grange kitchen and quickly sold out -- so be sure to mark July 2021 on your calendars!

How to Prevent Kitchen Fires

You can do a lot to prevent kitchen fires. While you can't remove every possible source of a kitchen fire, you can minimize fire risks by removing hazards and properly maintaining your kitchen.

Follow these prevention tips to keep your kitchen safe:

- Keep appliances serviced, clean, and in good repair.
- Unplug electric appliances when not in use.
- Use caution when lighting the pilot light or burner on a gas stove.
- Don't use metal in the microwave.
- Don't overfill pots or pans with oil or grease.
- Wipe up spills and don't cook on a dirty stove.
- Always roll up long sleeves and tie back long hair when cooking.
- Never leave cooking food unattended.
- Keep dish towels, pot holders, and paper towels away from the stove.

Finally, install a smoke detector close by but not in the kitchen. You don't want the small amount of smoke or steam that cooking



sometimes generates to constantly trigger the alarm but you do want it to sense an actual kitchen fire.

SEWER INFO

Sewer backups and flooding can cause devastating property damage and are not covered by standard homeowners' insurance policies. The majority of these claims are the responsibility of the property owner. Sewage from sanitary sewer lines occasionally back up into houses through drain pipes. These backups not only cause extensive water damage that is difficult and expensive to repair, but also create health hazards.

Haverford Township is not responsible for damages caused by sewers, drains and sump pumps except under limited/special circumstances provided by the PA Municipal Immunity laws.

Township residents must be aware that they should review their homeowner's, flood and sewer backup insurance coverage with their agent/insurance companies in order to properly protect their personal residence—probably the most valuable tangible asset that we all have.

Our Township Code states that all sewer service laterals from the Township's sewer, regardless of location, are the property of the customer and/or owner and shall be maintained by him in good condition and repair.
